At school, Bahá’í kids and youth are harassed by teachers and officials. Also, Bahá’ís aren’t allowed to go to college. As an

alternative, the Bahá’í Institute for Higher Education (BIHE) in Iran was created to give informal classes. But those who attend and teach at BIHE are often arrested and sometimes imprisoned.
